The ENTOMOLOGICAL SOCIETY OF QUEENSLAND, since its inception in 1923, has striven to promote the development of pure and applied entomological research in Australia and particularly in Queensland. Membership is open to anyone interested in Entomology. The Society promotes liaison among entomologists through regular meetings and the distribution of a *News Bulletin* to members. Meetings are announced in the *News Bulletin* and are normally held in the Entomology Department, The University of Queensland at 6.30 pm on the second Monday of each month (March to June, August to December each year). Visitors and prospective members are welcome. Membership information can be obtained from the Honorary Secretary or other office bearers.

Contributions to the *NEWS BULLETIN* such as items of news, trip reports, announcements, etc are welcome and should be sent to the *News Bulletin* Editor.

The Society publishes *THE AUSTRALIAN ENTOMOLOGIST*. This is a refereed, illustrated journal devoted to entomology of the Australian region, including New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and islands of the south western Pacific. The journal is published in four parts annually.

EMBLEM: The Society's emblem, chosen in 1973 on the 50th anniversary of the Society, is the king stag beetle, *Phalacrognathus muelleri* (Macleay), family Lucanidae. Its magnificent metallic purple and green colouration make it one of the most attractive of all Australian Coleoptera. It is restricted to the rainforests of northern Queensland.

COVER: A stiletto fly belonging to an undescribed genus and species of Therevidae (Diptera: Asiloidea) drawn by Shaun Winterton. Shaun and David Yeates are currently working on the systematics on this family, which is extremely diverse in the woodland and semi-arid habitats of Australia.



Annual Report for the Year 1997

The Council of the Entomological Society of Queensland takes pleasure in presenting its 1997 Annual Report. 1997 was the Society's 74th year.

The year began with the Annual General Meeting and Judy King's Presidential Address to the Society titled 'Forestry and entomology: snapshots'. Another highlight of the 1997 calendar was the biennial Perkins Memorial Lecture held in September. David Rentz of CSIRO Entomology, Canberra, spoke on 'The world's most unusual Gryllacridid - and other reasons to visit Queensland'. David's address was thoroughly enjoyed by over 50 members and guests who attended.

During the June Notes and Exhibits Meeting, the Society's 1997 Student Award was presented to Christine Lambkin of The University of Queensland. Christine's winning entry was her Honour's thesis titled 'Characters, congruence, and bee flies (Diptera: Bombyliidae)'.

Also awarded in 1997 was long-standing member Geoff Monteith. Geoff won the prestigious Australian National History Medallion awarded by the Field Naturalists Club of Victoria.

The Council would like to take this opportunity to thank our Sustaining Associates, Arrest-A-Pest, Rhone Poulenc Rural Australia, and the CRC for Tropical Pest Management for their continuing support of the Perkins Memorial Lecture and the Student Award.

The December Notes and Exhibits Meeting and Christmas Break-up at the CRC for Tropical Pest Management was well attended. The lively presentations and quality slides were enjoyed by all.

I am not seeking re-election in 1998 so I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of Council I have worked with over the past three

years for their support and friendship. I now look forward to attending meetings with nothing to do but enjoy!

Treasurer's Report

for the year ending 31 December 1997

The Society had an operating surplus of \$810.00 this year, which is pleasing given the deficits of the last few years. The improvement is due largely due to the flow-through from the higher subscription rates introduced last year, and a stabilization of the costs associated with producing the bulletin. Additionally, the expenditure for Bulletin printing of \$2,736.90 includes only 9 issues (Vol. 24, issues 9-10, and Vol. 25, issues 1-7).

Regrettably, a considerable number of members (90) have yet to pay their 1997 subscriptions. Of those, 26 also have all or part of their 1996 subscription still outstanding. The memberships of 13 individuals were terminated after the AGM for non-payment of dues, producing a write-off of \$665.00 in unpaid subscriptions.

Expenditure from the Sustaining Associates Fund totalled \$846.50, consisting of the \$250 Student Award, and the travel costs incurred by David Rentz for the Perkins Memorial Lecture (\$596.50). Three Sustaining Associates contributed a total of \$800.00 to the fund.

The 'Refreshment Fund' item gives a breakdown of the expenditure on food and drinks at all meetings during the year. Note that it costs us an average of \$20.47 per meeting (except December) to provide drinks and snacks, when donations at these meetings are taken into account. A surplus of \$34.72 was made from the December Notes and Exhibits meeting.

The Australian Entomologist 1997 Report

Volume 24 comprised 172 pages (10 in colour) in four parts. Three book or cd rom reviews and 29 papers were published in the volume. During the year 25 papers and two book/cd rom reviews were received, whilst three papers were rejected and one withdrawn. Nineteen papers are on hand for 1998.

Typesetting continues to be done 'in house' and the inclusion of colour is expected to be maintained in 1998. Efforts are underway to ensure papers are published within a year of receipt wherever possible and at present only two papers are outstanding from 1996 (both received in December) - one due to appear in volume 25 part 1 and one under revision by the author. The increased pagination of volume 24 enabled the bulk of the backlog of papers to be cleared and we thank authors for their patience while we caught up.

Once again we thank our referees for the time and effort they have put into the process and we also thank our printers for the high quality of the colour plates that have been a feature of this year's volume.

Financial Position

The number of subscriptions stands at 340, of which 88 are institutional. This represents an alarming decrease from the 360 subscriptions in 1996. The financial position remains sound with a small surplus of \$466.86 for 1997.

- 9. The main criterion for judging is 'scientific merit', and if 2 or more entries are of equal scientific merit then 'interest to members' is the second criterion.
