Contributions to the *News Bulletin* such as items of news, trip reports, announcements, etc are welcome and should be sent to the *News Bulletin Editor*.

The Society publishes **THE AUSTRALIAN ENTOMOLOGIST**. This is a refereed, illustrated journal devoted to Entomology in the Australian region, including New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and the islands of the South Western Pacific. The journal is published four parts annually.

EMBLEM: The Society's emblem, chosen in 1973 on the 50th anniversary of the Society, is the king stag beetle, *Phalacrognathus muelleri* (Macleay), family Lucanidae. Its magnificent purple and green colouration make it one of the most attractive of all Australian Coleoptera. It is restricted to the rainforests of Northern Queensland.



COLLECTING PERMITS FOR MEMBERS OF THE ENTOMOLOGICAL SOCIETY OF QUEENSLAND

Until recently anyone wishing to collect arthropod specimens for scientific study from National Parks, State Forests and Timber Reserves, or any protected species in Queensland, were required to have an appropriate permit for one or all of these categories. For State Forests and Timber Reserves 'Permits to Traverse' were also required before each collecting activity in addition to 'permits to collect'.

There were no previous arrangements allowing 'opportunistic' collection of specimens in these areas. New or interesting records could not be verified by collecting voucher specimens without prior issue of a permit. Other problems applied to collecting in State Forests and Timber Reserves and entomologists were unsure of the State land categories for which permits were required. When a 'nil return' (i.e. return indicating no specimens collected over 12 months) accompanied application for renewal, permit issue was refused. Moreover, the number of permits to traverse

required to cover all State Forests and Timber Reserves in Queensland, made authorised collecting by entomologists very difficult to organise.

Different policies appeared to apply to the issue of permits by each Regional Office and unexpected delays in receipt by applicants sometimes meant that expeditions had to be cancelled or deferred. Non-professional entomologists (including the majority of taxonomists) felt that they were being disadvantaged and the entomological community felt that the study of arthropods in protected areas in Queensland (to find out 'what was being protected') was being discouraged. The threatening processes and conservation status of species could not be determined with accuracy and inappropriate State listings resulted.

Changes began before the merging of several responsibilities of Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service (QPWS formerly Department of Environment) and the Queensland Forest Service and the changes resulted in a much more workable system for non-commercial entomologists in this State. In November 2000 a Scientific Purposes Permit was issued by QPWS after an application by Chris Burwell, then our President, allowing delegated ESQ members to collect protected insects subject to certain conditions. This permit did not allow collecting in National Parks or State Forests.

Subsequently in August 2002, after an application by Tim Heard our President, two Scientific Purposes Permits were issued subject to certain conditions, allowing the collecting of arthropods (but not crustaceans) in National Parks and protected arthropod species. In October 2002, a third permit was issued to Tim allowing ESQ members to collect from Queensland State Forests, Timber Reserves and Other State Lands.

These changes in policy for permit issue coincided with introduction of the 'Bug Catch' Program in March 2001. In a series of surveys entomologists (with strong representation by ESQ) have participated in recording for QPWS the arthropods of the Protected Areas of Queensland.

The 'Bug Catch' program and changes to permits to collect mark a new era of cooperation between entomologists, amateur and professional, and the Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service. It is not possible to acknowledge all those in QPWS, other State authorities, members of this Society and individuals who have helped facilitate these important changes. Particular thanks must go however, to Dr Geoff Lundie-Jenkins (QPWS Toowoomba), Dr Julia Playford, and Jenny Haines (QPWS Brisbane). Without their efforts and support none of the changes benefiting entomologists in Queensland, including permits for Society members, would have occurred.
